

## MINUTES OF THE HIGHWAY COMMISSION MEETING

August 2, 2023

The Williamson County Highway Commission met on Wednesday, August 2, 2023 at 8:30 a.m. at the Williamson County Highway Department facility at 302 Beasley Drive in Franklin, TN. Commission members present: County Mayor and Highway Commission Chairman Rogers Anderson, Stan Tyson, and David Coleman. Commissioners Charles Wilson and Wayne Davis were unable to attend.

Also present were: Eddie Hood, Highway Superintendent; Greg Boll, Elaine Vasquez, Brandon Wright, Highway Department; Joe Horne, Community Development Director; Floyd Heflin, William Andrews, Engineering; Michael Matteson, Planning Director; Phoebe Reilly, Budget Director; Leslie Mitchell, Purchasing Agent; Robert Cook, County Attorney, Buerger, Moseley, and Carson, and other interested individuals.

Chairman Anderson called the meeting to order at approximately 8:30 a.m. and called for the approval of the minutes of the July 5, 2023 meeting. Commissioner Tyson moved for approval of the minutes, seconded by Commissioner Coleman. The July 5, 2023 Highway Commission meeting minutes were approved unanimously, 3-0.

**Special Announcements:** There were no Special Announcements.

**Citizen Communications:** Mark Stewart, 6238 Patton Road. Mr. Stewart is concerned about flooding issues and wants the bridge on Patton Road to be replaced. He wants a deferral on the Patton Road relocation plan until more information is available.

Laurel Prothro, 6219 Patton Road. Ms. Prothro is concerned about the residents on Patton Road as well as residents on surrounding roads if Patton Road is closed for improvements. She wants a deferral on the Patton Road relocation plan until more information is available.

J.C. Burns, 6288 Patton Road. Mr. Burns is against closing Patton Road and wants a deferral on the relocation plan.

1. **A request from Scott Alexander, on behalf of the Nolensville Running Club, to utilize Kidd Road, McFarlin Road, Fly Road, Rocky Fork Road, and York Road which are more specifically described on the attached map, to conduct the annual Rollin Nolen Run, a charitable fundraising event to be held on October 21, 2023 beginning at 7:00 am and concluding at 11:00 am. (HC Wilson, CC District 5, Sanford/Smith).**

Superintendent Hood recommended approval.

County Attorney Cook stated that all paperwork is in order.

Commissioner Coleman moved for approval of the Nolensville Running Club to utilize the aforementioned County roads for a charitable fundraising event to be held on October 21, 2023. It was seconded by Commissioner Tyson and passed unanimously, 3-0.

2. **Jacob Vincent of Ragan Smith requesting connectivity on Broadway Street from Annecy Subdivision to Silver Stream Subdivision. (HC Wilson; CC District 5, Sanford/Smith).**

Superintendent Hood pointed out that Silver Stream Subdivision is within Williamson County jurisdiction, while Annecy Subdivision is within the jurisdiction of Nolensville City. Barricades were put up between the two subdivisions to keep people from using Broadway Street as a cut through street. It is a dead end as it stands right now. This item was pulled from the agenda. A motion was made by Commissioner Coleman to pull this item from the agenda. It was seconded by Commissioner Tyson and passed unanimously, 3-0.

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**3. Richard Houze of SEC, Inc. presenting relocation plans for Patton Road. (HC Wilson; CC District 5, Sanford/Smith).**

David Lamb of Burns Development presented Plans to improve a section of Patton Road near the intersection at Horton Highway, and to raise the road out of the flood plain. Superintendent Hood, Staff and Mr. Collier all agree that the current intersection at Horton Highway is in close proximity with Patterson Road and causes a safety issue. Utilizing the Gupta property to relocate the road provides safer access to Horton Highway than the current intersection. Plans include to move the intersection approximately 1500 feet to the north and raise the road bed from 6 inches to six feet out of the flood plain. A revised set of plans will be brought back before the board, however; Commissioner Coleman stated that the residents on Patton Road should be informed every step of the way before new plans are brought back.

**4. REPORT FOR ACCEPTANCE OF WEATHERFORD PASS AND BLACKWELL LANE, WEATHERFORD ESTATES SUBDIVISION, AS A PART OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM. (HC Wilson; CC District, Smith/Clifford).**

Superintendent Hood and Staff recommend acceptance. Commissioner Tyson moved for acceptance of the Report for Acceptance of the aforementioned streets in Weatherford Estates Subdivision. It was seconded by Commissioner Coleman and passed unanimously, 3-0.

**Commissioner Tyson:** Commissioner Tyson had no road issues to report.

**Commissioner Wilson:** Commissioner Wilson was unable to attend.

**Commissioner Davis:** Commissioner Davis was unable to attend.

**Highway Chairman Report:** Chairman Anderson had nothing further to report.

**Legal Issues:** County Attorney Cook had no legal issues to present.
