Mr. Graham stated that he is the President of the Oakwood HOA and stated that due to the tremendous growth within the County that he believes that the safety and fire protection of residents needs to be re-evaluated. Chairman Walton stated that Resolution No. 1-14-5, Resolution To Amend The Official Zoning Map, Originally Adopted May 14, 2012, As It Relates To Amending The Zoning District Of Properties Along Old Hillsboro Road, has been pulled by its sponsors.

Chairman Walton stated that Resolution No. 1-14-6, Resolution To Amend The Official Zoning Map, Originally Adopted May 14, 2012, As It Relates To Amending The Zoning District Of Properties Along Old Hillsboro Road And Del Rio Pike, has been pulled by its sponsors.

Chairman Walton stated that Resolution No. 1-14-7, Resolution To Amend The Official Zoning Map, Originally Adopted May 14, 2012, As It Relates To Amending The Zoning District Of Property On Old Hillsboro Road, has been pulled by its sponsors.

Chairman Walton stated that Resolution No. 1-14-8, Resolution Of The Williamson County Board Of Commissioners To Adopt Amendments To The 2013 Official Zoning Map Originally Adopted May 14, 2012, Regarding A Map Correction, has been pulled by its sponsors.

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Commissioner Brockman stated that she is disappointed that the Resolutions will not be able to be heard until the March meeting. She stated that certain deadlines were not met that resulted in delaying the hearing of the Resolutions.

Chairman Walton reminded the Commissioners that their annual ethics forms must be completed by January 31, 2014.

REPORTS

COUNTY MAYOR

Mayor Anderson asked Nena Graham, Budget Director, to give the financial report.

Ms. Graham stated that collections from the Cool Springs Conference Center for October were positive but November was a negative month. She stated that the Budget reports for October and November show that everything appears to be in order. Ms. Graham stated that the Privilege Tax Reports for October and November show a continuing positive trend.

Commissioner Danner asked why the County was on a different payment schedule with the Cool Springs Conference Center than the City of Franklin.

Mayor Anderson stated that the County chose to borrow money when the deal was originally completed.

SCHOOL

Dr. Mike Looney, Director of Schools, stated that everything is going well with the School System and asked the Commission to support the Resolutions being brought before the Commission tonight by the School System.

Commissioner Danner asked Dr. Looney when he would be asking for funding for the new schools in Nolensville and asked if he would ask for the funding simultaneously.

Dr. Looney stated that the School System will request funds for the projects simultaneously in May.

Commissioner Danner asked about possible rezoning and if the rezoning would take place across the County.

Dr. Looney stated that the rezoning will not affect the entire County.

Commissioner Hayes asked Cathy Montgomery, County Health Director, to address the current flu status of the County.

Ms. Montgomery stated that the Franklin and Fairview clinics have been providing free flu vaccines but she stated that the supply in both clinics is running out.

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Animal Control Department operates the Animal Control and Adoption Center located at 106 Claude Yates Drive, Franklin, Tennessee at which it houses and cares for domestic animals; and

WHEREAS, Williamson Animal Services, Inc., "WAS", is a 501(c)(3) corporation that was formed for the purpose of creating a nonprofit entity to accept donations to assist the Williamson County Animal Control and Adoption Center when assistance is needed; and

WHEREAS, the Animal Control Department has expressed a need for a commercial washer and dryer, to replace three household washers and dryers, to use in laundering and drying towels and bedding for the animals being housed at the Center, and "WAS" has agreed to donate the funds for the washer and dryer needed; and

WHEREAS, bids were solicited and received for the washer and dryer according to County Purchasing policies, with the low bid meeting specifications being \$11,200; and

WHEREAS, Williamson County Property Management will install the washer and dryer; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Board of Commissioners finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Williamson County to accept the generous donation of \$11,200.00 to purchase the washer and dryer;
