MINUTES

The Williamson County Election Commission met electronically in a special called meeting under Governor Bill Lee's Executive Order 16 which had been superseded by Executive Order 34 on Wednesday, July 22, 2020, at 4:00 p.m. at the Williamson County Administrative Complex.

Mr. Brown called the meeting to order.

A roll call of present members was taken and the following members were present: Robert D. Brown, Chairman; Dana Smyth, Secretary; Phyllis Streiff, Member; and Chad Gray, Administrator of Elections. Mr. Brown called the meeting to order.

Mr. Brown asked to defer any discussion of any policies and procedures regarding poll officials until another meeting.


Mr. Duda made a motion to set the Town of Nolensville Special Election pending the outcome of the referendum to adopt a City-Manager Commission Charter in the Town of Nolensville for Tuesday, September 15, 2020. Mrs. Streiff seconded the motion. Mr. Duda made a few comments regarding the fact that some of the sections in the Tennessee Code are not completely in agreement with each other on a situation such as this and that any perception that the Commission is making any sort of endorsement on this matter would be incorrect. It passed 4-0.

The Commission agreed to meet on Thursday, August 20, 2020, to certify the August 6, 2020, election results and determine any other applicable dates regarding the potential Town of Nolensville Special Election.

Mr. Duda provided some information regarding policies and procedures relative to Poll Worker Evaluations, specifically in reference to Blount and Hamilton Counties.

The Commission agreed to convene again on Election Day, August 6, 2020, at 6:45 a.m. to convene the Absentee Counting Board.

The meeting was then adjourned.
