




































































emergency kit



radio:

batterypowered



umbrella



dust mask to help filter contaminated air

plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place



cash and coins



photocopies of credit and identification cards, insurance cards, and important papers



radio: hand crank



blanket



water

3-day supply for drinking and sanitation, per person, per day



items for infants:

formula, diapers, bottles, and pacifiers



spare clothes, with layers for different temperatures



first aid kit



flashlight



written or printed contact information, as a backup to phones



paper, pencil, and pen



extra batteries



whistle to signal for help



specific items your family needs, such as prescription meds, eye glasses, hearing aid batteries



non-perishable food

3-day supply

include kitchen utensils and a can opener



sanitation & hygiene items

toilet paper, moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties



local maps



an evacuation plan, so everyone knows where the emergency kits are located and where to go



chargers and powerbank



matches in a waterproof container



pet items, including vet information

list of hotels and boarding facilities that can take your pets
