Re: Political Signs in the unincorporated areas of Williamson County

Dear Candidate:

This letter is written as a reminder for those of you who are planning on posting political signs for the upcoming election. The following are sign regulations as they pertain to political signs in the unincorporated area of Williamson County, and as excerpted from the Williamson County Zoning Ordinance.

The following regulations are for **Temporary Political Signs**:

Political signs (or temporary signs of any type) **may not be located within**, or project into, any **public road right-of-way** in the unincorporated area of the County (per 8170D).

Political signs located on **private property** are **exempt** from County regulation.

In addition to ordinance requirements, the Williamson County Commission has passed a resolution to prohibit temporary political signs on property owned by the County.

So, place your campaign signs on private property with the owner's permission, and no permits are required. Should you have any questions, please call our office. Good luck with your campaign.
