

**WILLIAMSON COUNTY JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER
2017 ANNUAL PREA REPORT**

Introduction:

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was passed into law in 2003 by President George W. Bush. The Act mandates zero tolerance of sexual abuse inside correctional facilities. Standards have been established to detect and prevent sexual abuse and sexual harassment in detention facilities. This report has been compiled in compliance with those standards.

PREA Incident Types by allegation:

- Substantiated: Investigated and determined to have occurred.
- Unsubstantiated: Investigated and the investigation produced insufficient evidence to make a final determination as to whether or not the event occurred.
- Unfounded: An allegation that was investigated and determined to not have occurred.
- Ongoing: Investigation has not been completed.

Investigations:

Williamson County Juvenile Detention Center (WCJDC) ensures that an administrative and/or criminal investigation is completed for all allegations of sexual abuse and sexual harassment.

Inmates and incidents included in data collection:

The data collected to compile this annual report includes all reports of incidents of resident-on-resident or staff-on-resident sexual misconduct, sexual harassment, or sexual abuse occurring between January 1, 2017 and December 31, 2017 involving residents housed in Williamson County Juvenile Detention Center.


