A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE FAIRVIEW, TENNESSEE MUNICIPAL ELECTION BE HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NOVEMBER 8, 2022, STATE OF TENNESSEE GENERAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, The State of Tennessee General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 8, 2022, and,

WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Fairview, Tennessee to have the Municipal Election for the City of Fairview, Tennessee conducted on the same date, Tuesday, November 8, 2022 and,

WHEREAS, the Administrator of Elections for Williamson County, Tennessee must have a Resolution from the Board of Commissioners for the City of Fairview, Tennessee relative to the said election and the Board of Commissioners for the City's desire to have the City of Fairview, Tennessee, Municipal Election conducted in conjunction with the State of Tennessee General Election to be conducted Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW, TENNESSEE.

1. The Municipal Election for the City of Fairview, Tennessee, shall be conducted in conjunction with the Tuesday, November 8, 2022, State of Tennessee General Election.
2. The Newspaper for the publication of the required legal election notices is the Fairview Observer.
3. The City of Fairview, Tennessee, **Offices to be elected are Three (3) Members of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Fairview, Tennessee.** The qualifications for these offices are those required for election to the Office of Commissioner and are listed in the City of Fairview, Tennessee Charter Section C-20, Article 6-20-103 which states as follows: "A qualified voter of the city, other than a person qualified to vote based only on nonresident ownership of real property under §6-20-106(b), shall be eligible for election to the office of commissioner." Persons seeking to be elected to either of these Offices must not be prohibited from holding public office under any of the provisions of T.C.A. §8-18-101 those provisions are as follows: "All persons eighteen (18) years of age or older who are citizens of the United States and of this state, and have been inhabitants of the state, county, district, or circuit for the period required by the constitution and laws of the state, are qualified to hold office under the authority of this state except:

(A) Those who have been convicted of offering or giving a bribe, or of larceny, or any other offense declared infamous by law, unless restored to citizenship in the mode pointed out by law;

(A) Those against whom there is a judgment unpaid for any moneys received by them, in any official capacity, due to the United States, to this state, or any county of this state;

(C) Those who are defaulters to the treasury at the time of the election, and the election of any such person shall be void;

(D) Soldiers, sailors, marines, or airmen in the regular army or navy or air force of the United States; and

(E) Members of congress, and persons holding any office of profit or trust under any foreign power, other state of the union, or under the United States.”

4. It is understood and accepted by the City of Fairview, Tennessee that the qualifying deadline for both offices will be Thursday, August 18, 2022, at 12:00 Noon. Qualifying petitions will be available for candidates for these offices to obtain Monday, June 20, 2022.

5. The election for the three (3) seats will be a single election in which all election winners will be seated to four (4) year terms.

6. The City Attorney of the City of Fairview, Tennessee is authorized to communicate this Resolution regarding the City of Fairview, Tennessee, Municipal Election to be held in conjunction with the Tuesday, November 8, 2022, State of Tennessee General Election and is instructed to deliver a certified copy of this Resolution to the Williamson County Election Commission (Administrator of Elections) within Seven (7) days of its adoption.

**A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE NOLENSVILLE, TENNESSEE MUNICIPAL
ELECTION BE HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STATE OF TENNESSEE
GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 8th, 2022**

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 8, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Town of Nolensville, Tennessee for the municipal election to be conducted on the same day as the State of Tennessee General Election, Tuesday, November 8, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the Administrator of Elections for Williamson County, Tennessee has requested a Resolution of the Board of Commissioners relative to the said election expressing the desire to hold the Town of Nolensville, Tennessee municipal election in conjunction with the State of Tennessee General Election to be conducted Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

**NOW, THERE BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF
THE TOWN OF NOLENSVILLE, TENNESSEE AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. The Municipal Election for the Town of Nolensville, Tennessee, shall be conducted in conjunction with the Tuesday, November 8, 2022 State of Tennessee General Election.

SECTION 2. The newspaper for publication of the required legal election notices is will be published in the *Williamson Herald*.

SECTION 3. The Town of Nolensville, Tennessee will have two (2) seats on the Board of Commissioners to be included on the election ballot: Two (2) Commissioners (Four Year Terms).

SECTION 4. The residential qualification for Commissioner of the Town of Nolensville, as stated in the Charter, § 6-20-103, are as follows, "A qualified voter of the city, other than a person qualified to vote based only on nonresident ownership of real property under § 6-20-106(b), shall be eligible for election to the office of commissioner."

SECTION 5. Persons seeking to be elected to either of these Commissioner seats must not be prohibited from holding public office under any of the provisions of T.C.A. §8-18-101.

Those provisions are as follows: "All persons eighteen (18) years of age or older who are citizens of the United States and of this state, and have been inhabitants of the state, county, district, or circuit for the period required by the constitution and laws of the state, are qualified to hold office under the authority of this state except:

- (1) Those who have been convicted of offering or giving a bribe, or of larceny, or any other offense declared infamous by law, unless restored to citizenship in the mode pointed out by law; and,
- (2) Those against whom there is a judgment unpaid for any moneys received by them, in any official capacity, due to the United States, to this state, or any county of this state; and,
- (3) Those who are defaulters to the treasury at the time of the election, and the election of any such person shall be void; and,
- (4) Soldiers, sailors, marines, or airmen in the regular army or navy or air force of the United States; and,
- (5) Members of congress, and persons holding any office of profit or trust under any foreign power, other state of the union, or under the United States."


SECTION 6. It is understood and accepted by the Town of Nolensville, Tennessee that the qualifying deadline for both Commissioner seats will be Thursday, August 18, 2022 at 12:00 Noon. Qualifying petitions will be available for candidates for these offices can be obtained at the Williamson County Election Commission Office located at 405 Downs Blvd in Franklin, TN.

SECTION 7. No unexpired terms will be elected on this election cycle.

SECTION 8: This resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

Williamson County Election Commission**

Mr. Gray,

Per your request, please let this letter serve as formal notice to the Williamson County Election Commission from the Town of Thompson's Station of the following:

1. The Municipal Election for the Town of Thompson's Station shall be conducted in conjunction with the Tuesday, November 8, 2022 State of Tennessee General Election.
2. The legally required election notices for the Municipal Election for the Town of Thompson's Station should be published in the *Williamson AM* newspaper.
3. The Town of Thompson, Tennessee, offices to be elected are three (3) members of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen, consisting of two (2) Aldermen and one (1) Mayor. The qualifications for these offices are those required for election to the offices of Alderman and Mayor and are listed in the Town of Thompson's Station, Tennessee Charter, C-30, which is the general act charter located at Tenn. Code Ann. § 6-3-103, which states as follows:
 - (A) No person shall be eligible for the office of mayor unless such person has resided within the municipality for at least one (1) year next preceding the election.
 - (B) No person shall be eligible for the office of alderman unless such person has resided within the ward for at least one (1) year next preceding the election. (C) Residence within any area annexed in a year preceding an election shall be counted in meeting the residence requirement of this section.
 - (D) Any officer moving from such officer's ward, in the case of an alderman, or moving from the municipality, in the case of the mayor, during the term of office shall be presumed to have vacated the office, and it shall be declared vacant, and filled as provided in § 6-3-107."
