Next 20 years (2045)


- University of Tennessee – 3% annual – 13,829 to 27,292
- Planning Consultant (STV) – 5% annual- 13,829 to 46,820
- Greater Nashville Regional Council – 7% annual- 13,829 to 65,556

How Nolensville Developed Proposed UGB Map Update

- What we considered:
 - Population and economic growth trends
 - Projected infrastructure availability (water, sewer, roads, etc.)
 - Public feedback
 - Need for additional land suitable for future growth to accommodate population and employment
 - Reasonably compact yet sufficiently sized to accommodate growth within the next 20 years
 - Contiguous to current UGB

Nolensville UGB Map Update – Dec. 9, 2021


- Approved by Planning Commission in November 2021

- Shows both 2023 UGB revision area & proposed UGB 5yr evaluation area






Williamson County, TN Proposed Urban Growth Boundaries & Planned Growth Areas



Nolensville Proposed Urban Growth Boundary Area Expansion Map Revision – 2023/2024




Urban Growth Boundary Expansion Update – 2023/2024

Nolensville UGB Expansion Map By The Numbers

- Existing Town Boundaries are 10.4 square miles & 13,829 people as of the 2020 Census. Growth that has occurred since the 2020 Census has increased the population to somewhere between 15,000 and 16,000 people.
- Current UGB area in yellow is 8.4 square miles.
- Proposed UGB Expansion Area in green is 3.5 square miles
- If approved by the State (LGPAC) the Nolensville UGB area would increase in size from 8.4 square miles to 11.9 square miles

What the Nolensville UGB Expansion Area Will Not Do if approved

- This is not an annexation plan. Under Tennessee law (TCA) annexation only occurs at the request of the property owner.
- Your property tax will not change unless you request to be annexed into the Town boundaries.
- This will not change your address. Addressing is handled by the Post Office and would not be impacted by the adoption of a new Growth Plan.
